ICRC IN LIBERIA

The International Committee of the Red Cross continues to help the Liberian authorities to respond to humanitarian needs, while strengthening the capacities of different national institutions. As such, the ICRC did perform the following activities from January to August 2016:



People deprived of their freedom

- 2,200 detainees visited to ensure decent treatment and improved living conditions
- 76 Red Cross messages collected and 34 distributed



84 detainees communicated with their families through direct phone calls



850 detainees and **prison staff** benefited from improved water and hygiene facilities





648 mats, 828 blankets, 64 barrels, 266 buckets, 265 jerry cans, 826 toothpaste, 826 toothbrushes, 350 spoons, 490 plates, 58 hygiene pads, 20 hygiene towels, 28 mattresses and 183 mosquito nets provided to detainees

13 prison clinics supplied with essential drugs



- **60 detainees** with medical problems individually followed up for medical treatment
- 110 malnourished detainees received therapeutic feeding



- 30 correction officers, kitchen staff and inmates benefited from storeroom management and kitchen hygiene training
- 11 detainees received surgical treatment for various infections through ICRC's intervention





Restoring family links

- 20 children reunited with their loved ones
 - **280 phone calls** made to family members of children and adults



91 Red Cross messages collected for children and vulnerable adults and 29 distributed





Access to water and improved sanitation

- 11 new wells constructed and 7 wells rehabilitated benefiting 4,060 community dwellers
- 7 communities comprising 1,650 beneficiaries were officially declared
 Open Defecation Free by the National Technical Coordination Unit with ICRC's support



- 25 water and sanitation committees formed in communities for proper maintenance of water points
- 10 communities mobilized in behavior change for heathier environment





Income support to ebola affected families

- 1,700 families received direct cash support to restore their livelihood
- 1,190 families reestablished their businesses through training following cash support



Promoting international humanitarian law and humanitarian principles

- 116 peacekeepers from troop-contributing countries were briefed about IHL and the Red Cross Movement
- 125 Armed Forces of Liberia soldiers received pre-deployment briefing on Red Cross Movement and IHL
- 24 senior and non-commissioned officers of the Armed Forces of Liberia benefited from IHL training
- 480 copies of international humanitarian law training manual were delivered to the Armed Forces of Liberia
- 753 joint security agency officers gained knowledge in humanitarian principles and Red Cross Movement



Supporting the Liberian Red Cross

- 965 security agency officers received basic first aid training
- 414 fire and flood victim families (2,484 persons) received relief and recovery assistance
- 200 vulnerable women received psychological support and skills training
